<b>Description:</b>	This program focuses on the occurrence and risk areas of earthquakes, tsunamis, floods, landslides and sink-holes through management before and after the phenomena. The objectives are to develop knowledge about how natural

disaster management is best conducted in areas of relevance of natural disaster academy. The capacity to manage and to prevent natural disasters depends, to a large extent, on effective collaboration and coordination between government and other sectors, which in turn requires effective communication among them. Another focus is on community-based natural disaster management and holistic livelihood patterns aimed at building up capacity to manage and/or prevent natural disasters, and develop sustainability in the long term including the knowledge, experiences and skills concerned with environmental and resource preservation. Community motivation and mobilization will be discussed to ensure continued community ownership and responsibility for natural disaster-proofing and preparedness activities.

These four weeks long intensive and interactive course will have a minimum structured time of 140 tutor contact hours, consisting of lectures on important tropical diseases, medical ward rounds and clinical experiences, laboratory demonstrations and practice on medically important parasites prevalent in South-East Asia. Slides and a DVD presentation of tropical diseases and the health system and a clinical practice in Thailand's community hospital will be included.




<b>Description:</b>	This course will give individuals working in a wide range of institutional situations, both programme and project based, and governmental organizations, the opportunity to acquire a thorough grounding in conceptual, analytical and applied techniques relevant to their responsibilities in gender and development. This course uses the gender concepts and analytical framework to examine health development issues and strategies. This course aims to develop planner's understanding of gender relations with a range of sectoral issues including health, family planning and maternal and child health care, sexuality, AIDS, violence and the policy.

<b>Description:</b>	This special module provides students/ participants with conceptual and practical skills for qualitative data analysis and interpretation. Step-by-step, the students/ participants will be equipped with the ability to efficiently sort, group, transform data and experiences into concepts, patterns of relationships and new ideas, and then to put them together in report form to communicate the findings of the research project to others.

## Research Methods

<b>Target group:</b>	People who are interested in the field of social research methods.
<b>Description:</b>	This training program includes 2 courses: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Social Research Methodology: This course aims to familiarize trainees with the arts and science of quantitative and qualitative research techniques and procedures for population, reproductive health, and HIV/AIDS research. Major topics to be discussed include defining research objectives, formulating the conceptual framework and hypotheses, sample design, techniques of data collection, data management and analysis, and report writing.</li> </ul>

- **Statistics for Social Analysis:** This course provides a general introduction to the standard descriptive and inferential statistical methods used in social science research. Statistical techniques include bivariate and multivariate techniques. The emphasis of the course is on understanding the logic of the techniques and developing the ability to interpret statistical results. Trainees will undertake exercises using the different methods, with the examples drawn from data dealing with reproductive health. In addition, the SPSS PC+ program is taught in order to help trainees use computers to carry out their analyses.

## Reproductive Health and HIV/AIDS

**Target group:** People who are interested in the field of Reproductive Health and HIV/AIDS.

**Description:** This training program includes 2 courses:

- **Reproductive Health: Perspectives and Important Issues.**

This course provides trainees with substantive knowledge in the major areas of reproductive health, namely, fertility and family planning, sexually transmitted diseases including HIV/AIDS, reproductive tract infections, maternal and child health, abortion, special reproductive health needs of adolescents, and menopause. Relevant policy issues will be explored and discussed.

- **Behavioral and Social Dimensions of AIDS**

This course presents the behavioral and social perspectives, concepts and data necessary for understanding human behavior related to STDs and HIV/AIDS. The sexual behavior of both males and females within a variety of sociocultural contexts will be discussed in order to gain insights into the AIDS epidemic and to assist in understanding policy options and program implications.

<b>Target group:</b>	Open to all disciplines
<b>Description:</b>	<p>This training program includes 2 courses:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Substantive Demography</li> </ul> <p>Trainees will be oriented to fundamental concepts in the study of human populations, including their size, structure and distribution. Factors affecting population change, such as ethnic, social and economic structure are also discussed. Participants in the course are introduced to demographic theories and their applications for population and reproductive health research. Topics covered include fertility, nuptiality, mortality and migration. Discussion is geared towards understanding implications of these demographic processes for reproductive health.</p> <li>• Analytical Techniques in Demography</li> <p>This course introduces trainees to standard techniques of demographic analysis. The methods taught include measurement of fertility, family planning, nuptiality, mortality, life table methods, migration, and population estimates and projections. The course is taught through a combination of lectures and exercises.</p>

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
