## Mahidol University participated in the “UNESCO Fifth Stakeholders Meeting on Internationalization of Higher Education in Asia and the Pacific”

On 7<sup>th</sup> December 2023, **Assoc. Prof. Nopraenuw Sajjarax Dhirathiti**, Vice President for International Relations and Corporate Communication, presented Mahidol University’s visions and initiatives at the UNESCO Fifth Stakeholders’ Meeting on the Internationalization of Higher Education in Asia and the Pacific. The discussion focused on “Challenging Knowledge Diplomacy to Achieve Our Common Agenda.”

The meeting occurred from 7<sup>th</sup> - 8<sup>th</sup> December 2023 in Bangkok under the joint auspices of the UNESCO Regional Office in Bangkok, the Graduate School of Education at The University of Tokyo, and the Global Asia Research Center at Waseda University. On this occasion, **Dr. Wesley Teter**, Senior Consultant for Educational Innovation and Skills Development (EISD) at the UNESCO Regional Office in Bangkok, served as the moderator. The event brought together representatives from India, China, Malaysia, Vietnam, Cambodia, the Philippines, and South Korea.

On 18<sup>th</sup> December 2023, Mahidol University executives led by **Clinical Prof. Emeritus Piyasakol Sakolsatayadorn**, Chairman of the University Council; **Assoc. Prof. Tara Vongviriyangkoon**, Vice Director of Siriraj Hospital, along with faculty, staff, and students participated in the Sustainable Symposium: The Societal Impacts under the theme “Let’s Change Our Society for A Better Future” at Prince Mahidol Hall.

On this occasion, **Dr. Gemma Edgar**, Counselor (Development), Australian Embassy in Bangkok, delivered the opening remarks and discussed the Australian Embassy’s support for the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in Thailand along with **Assoc. Prof. Nopraenuw Sajjarax Dhirathiti**, Vice President for International Relations and Corporate Communication, delivered the welcome speech to the attendees and **Assoc. Prof. Dr. Vichita Ractham**, Dean, College of Management, provided insights into the purpose of the symposium.

The College of Management, in collaboration with the International Relations Division, Faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities, Faculty of Liberal Arts, Research Institute for Languages and Cultures of Asia, and College of Religious Studies, organized the Sustainable Symposium: The Societal Impacts. The symposium had the primary goal of investigating ideas and approaches related to sustainable development and operational frameworks, with insights drawn from social studies academics. Additionally, it underscored the importance of raising awareness about the crucial role that universities and faculties in the social sciences play in advancing sustainable development in Thailand. This involvement spans research, education, and community participation, aiming to promote sustainability for the future.

## MUIC attended the 6<sup>th</sup> Thailand Education Fair in Myanmar

On 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2023, Mahidol University International College (MUIC) actively participated in the 6<sup>th</sup> Thailand Education Fair in Myanmar at the Park Royal Hotel in Yangon.
