Mahidol University Announcement

Subject: Criteria and Procedures for Student Health Services

B.E. 2566 (A.D. 2023)

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It is considered appropriate to improve criteria and procedures for student health services to better facilitate the University students.

As empowered by virtue of the statement in clauses 22.8 and 23 of the Mahidol University Announcement on Regulations and Methods to Receive, Maintain, Disburse, Pay, and Control Money B.E. 2551 (A.D. 2008), and its amendments, along with clause 8 (7) of the Mahidol University Announcement on the Management of Student Affairs Fund Account, B.E. 2566 (A.D. 2023), the President has, therefore, issued the announcement as follows:

Clause 1 Abrogate the Announcement of Mahidol University on Criteria and Procedures for Student Health Services, B.E.2563 (A.D. 2020), dated 2 July B.E.2563 (2020).

Clause 2 This announcement shall come into force for the students with identification codes beginning with 63XXXXX, who have enrolled since the B.E. 2563 (A.D. 2020) academic year onwards.

The students who have enrolled in the university before the B.E. 2563 (A.D. 2020) academic year shall follow the Announcement of Mahidol University on Criteria and Procedures for Student Health Services, B.E. 2561 (A.D. 2018).

Clause 3 Pursuant to this announcement:

“University” means Mahidol University;

“Student” means university and school students who have completely paid tuition fees including student health service fees, student activity and sports fees to the university as specified in the university announcements of each semester;

“Health services” means receiving services for diagnosis, treatment of symptoms or diseases, rehabilitation, and other relevant services to restore the body or mind to a normal state, but not include services provided in specialized clinics;

"Dental services" means receiving services for examination and treatment of oral health symptoms or diseases, rehabilitation, and other relevant services to maintain oral health to a normal state, but not include services provided in the specialized clinic;

"Expenses" means the money that health service providers or hospitals charge for the cost of medicine, blood and components of blood or substitutes, intravenous fluid or food, oxygen, and others for treatment, medical service fees, diagnosis cost, but not to include the analysis service fees, cost of treatment, and other services about pregnancy, cost of treatment for chronic diseases that students have had before enrolling in the university, or various special expenses such as organ fees, fees and services that are called otherwise, which is for compensation, and cost of beauty enhancement;

"Student healthcare units" means the student healthcare service units of the university;

"Mahidol University-affiliated healthcare facilities" means Siriraj Hospital, Ramathibodi Hospital, Hospital for Tropical Diseases, Golden Jubilee Medical Center, Dental Hospital of the Faculty of Dentistry, Maha Chakri Sirindhorn Dental Hospital of the Faculty of Dentistry, Ramathibodi Chakri Naruebodindra Hospital, Faculty of Medicine Ramathibodi Hospital, and Mahidol Bamrungrak Medical Center;

“Network healthcare facilities” means healthcare service providers that hold an agreement or coordination with Mahidol University to provide the students with health services, but they are not the University-affiliated facilities;

“Fund” means the Student Affairs Fund in accordance with the Mahidol University Announcement on Student Affairs Funding Accounts Management;

“Basic rights” means the rights to access National Health Insurance Rights, Comptroller General's Department Scheme, State Enterprise Officer Scheme, or Social Security Scheme.

Clause 4 Students shall be eligible for health and dental services in accordance with this announcement only when they have paid tuition fees for the semester of their registered programs. The eligibility to receive the services shall be valid from the beginning of the registered semester until the beginning of the following semester. The students who have enrolled for their first year of study and paid the tuition fees shall have access to university health services one month before the beginning of the semester as announced by the university or related divisions.

As for the programs that organize teaching and learning for more than 2 semesters in an academic year, the students must pay the tuition fees to cover the study as specified by the university in order for them to be eligible to receive health and dental services.

In addition, the student's rights to receive health and dental services according to this announcement shall cover the following cases:

- (1) When the students register to maintain their student status and completely pay the tuition fees specified by the university;
- (2) When the students receive full scholarships for tuition fees;
- (3) When the students receive a partial scholarship for tuition fees that does not cover health service fees and the students pay the difference in tuition fees in full;
- (4) When the students get approved for a deferment and payment of the full tuition fee within the period specified by the university;

Clause 5 Administration of health and dental service rights

(5.1) Thai nationality students are eligible to utilize their registered basic rights. The reimbursement of expenses for the registered basic rights stated in paragraph one needs to follow the criteria and procedures established by the university as detailed in Annex 1 attached to this announcement.

(5.2) Students of other nationalities shall get health insurance provided by their affiliates or the University, which must cover, at its minimum, the following:

(5.2.1) Inpatient health insurance (IPD)

- (1) Expenses for room and meal per day no less than 31 days per Policy year
- (2) Expenses for intensive care unit stay (ICU) for no less than 7 days per policy year
- (3) Other medical expenses such as ambulance fee
- (4) Surgery costs
- (5) Doctor visit fee, once a day, for no less than 30 days per policy year
- (6) Emergency medical expenses in case of accidents
- (7) Consultation fees for medical specialists

(5.2.2) Outpatient health insurance (OPD), once a day for no less than 30 times per policy year.

Clause 6 To receive health services and dental services, students shall always present their ID card (for Thai nationality students) or passport or copy of their passport (for students of other nationalities), along with their student identification card to the student health service units, the University-affiliated facilities, or network healthcare facilities. This is to validate the eligibility for medical welfare rights before receiving the services.

Clause 7 Students can receive health services at the designated medical facilities as follows:

(7.1) To receive healthcare services during regular office hours, students shall visit student healthcare units of their faculties or nearby faculties, University-affiliated facilities, or network healthcare facilities following the criteria established by the student healthcare units, University-affiliated facilities, or network healthcare facilities as detailed in Annex 2 attached to this announcement.

(7.2) To receive healthcare services during non-office hours, the students shall visit the University-affiliated facilities following their specified criteria and schedules.

(7.3) To receive healthcare services due to emergency illnesses or accidents, the students shall receive services from student healthcare units and other healthcare facilities respectively as follows:

(7.3.1) the nearest student healthcare units;

(7.3.2) the University-affiliated facilities, or network healthcare facilities;

(7.3.3) Other medical facilities for students to get reimbursement from their registered basic rights.

Clause 8 To receive dental services, the students shall visit the University-affiliated facilities as follows:

(8.1) Thai nationality students who are eligible for their basic rights to be covered by the University-affiliated units shall receive services according to those basic rights;

(8.2) Thai nationality students, who are not eligible for their basic rights to be covered by the University-affiliated facilities, and students of other nationalities, shall advance the payment and use payment evidence to be reimbursed from the university (as detailed in Annex3). This is included in the limit of expenses from the fund according to clause 9.

Clause 9 The university shall provide support to students for their health and dental service expenses from the designated fund account within the amount of 30,000 baht per person per academic year in the following cases:

(9.1) When the students receive health and dental services based on their basic rights stated in Clause 5 and their expenses exceed the amount of the basic right coverage, but do not exceed the items specified by the Comptroller General's Department, due to the need of treatment recommended by the doctor, or expenses for the medicines not included in the National List of Essential Medicines as detailed in Annex 4 attached to this announcement.

(9.2) When the students receive health services during the registration process for their basic right coverage under the University-affiliated facilities, however, they are still ineligible for reimbursement. The support only covers expenses on services from the University-affiliated facilities.

(9.3) When the students have emergency illnesses and need to be urgently sent to the healthcare facilities by ambulance, the support only covers services from the University-affiliated facilities or network healthcare facilities.

(9.4) When the students have emergency illnesses and need to be urgently sent to the healthcare facilities, but no vehicle can be provided in the university, the students can reimburse the actual amount paid within the limit amount of 500 baht per trip.

(9.5) Thai nationality students who have no basic rights covered by the University-affiliated facilities, and students of other nationalities shall reimburse their dental treatment expenses within the amount of 500 baht per academic year.

In the case that the university deems it appropriate to provide funds to support the students' expenses for the excess of the amount specified in paragraph one, the assigned Vice President shall exercise his discretion to consider the support on a case-by-case basis. In that case, the students must receive health services from healthcare facilities as detailed in Annex 2.

Clause 10 To reimburse the advance payment from the fund account according to clause 9, the students are required to proceed as follows.

(10.1) The students submit a reimbursement request form for medical/dental expenses, as specified by the university, and provide relevant evidence as listed below:

(10.1.1) receipt (original copy)

(10.1.2) medical certificate (original copy)

(10.1.3) certificate of use of drugs not included in the main essential drug list (if any)

(10.1.4) a certified true copy of the student identification card (or use the Virtual ID Card from We Mahidol Application)

(10.1.5) a certified true copy of an ID card (for Thai nationality students) or a certified true copy of a passport (for international students)

(10.1.6) A certified true copy of the student's bank account book containing the bank name, account number, and the student account name. In the case that there are any fees or other service charges (if any) related to the paying or transferring medical or dental expenses charged by the bank, the university shall deduct fees or other service charges (if any) as actual payment from the medical or dental expenses that must be reimbursed to students.

(10.2) The students are required to submit all the reimbursement documents according to clause 10 to the following divisions within one year from the date specified on the receipt:

(10.2.1) The students at the levels lower than bachelor's degree and bachelor's degree shall send the documents to “Student Affairs Division Mahidol Learning Center, Mahidol University No. 999 Phutthamonthon Sai 4 Road, Salaya Subdistrict, Phutthamonthon District, Nakhon Pathom Province 73170 (Documents for Reimbursement of Medical Expenses)”

(10.2.2) Graduate students shall send the documents to “Graduate School Mahidol University, No. 25/25 Moo 5, Graduate School Building Mahidol University, Phutthamonthon Sai 4 Road, Salaya Subdistrict, Phutthamonthon District, Nakhon Pathom Province 73170”

Clause 11 When students graduate/ or their status as students terminates as approved by the university council, the university shall proceed to submit their names back to the National Health Security Office (NHSO) in order to restore their basic healthcare rights to the medical facilities in the area of their registered address where they have had the basic right coverage prior to entering the university.

Clause 12 Payment according to this announcement shall be disbursed from the Student Affairs Fund in accordance with Mahidol University Announcement on Student Affairs Fund Management with the approval of the President or designated Vice President.

Clause 13 Any operations that do not comply with this announcement or require deviation from its provisions stated herein shall be subject to the President's discretion, and the President's decision shall be final.

This announcement shall come into force from now onwards.
